#### **Attendance in the Spotlight: Establishing Routines**

The clocks will go back on the 30<sup>th</sup> October, meaning that the dark nights and mornings will be upon us. Children and adults alike may find it difficult to adjust to the change in the weather and daylight hours. Please bear in mind that if your children are tired it will be of great benefit to encourage them to have a sensible bedtime and morning routine.

#### Morning

- Mornings should be as calm as possible, if the evening/bedtime routine is followed and children know that their school equipment is prepared and they are ready to face the day.
- Sticker charts can be used to encourage children to brush their teeth, get dressed and ready for school. (Please see Becky Railton, HSSW for further details).

#### **Evening/Bedtime**

- Ensure homework is completed on time daily and if your child(ren) are finding the homework difficult, please make an appointment to see their class teacher(s) to discuss this.
- Help your child to pack their book bag, set out their uniform, shoes and coat ready for morning and give them the responsibility of doing this
- A warm drink and a warm bath at bedtime can help to relax your child(ren).
- Reading your child a story at bedtime or playing story CD or relaxing music can be very beneficial.

- Ensure that your alarm is set at a reasonable time for the morning and fail-safe.

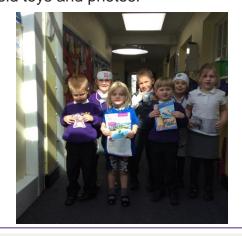
# Virtual Vikings – Years 5 and 6 – Wednesday, 19th October 2016

#### **Unicef News**

Recently we have sent out flyers which explain how we have become a Rights Respecting School and we hold a Level 2 Award which is the highest level achievable. This means that at our school we teach children about Children's Rights. These come from the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child UNCRC.

As a result of our work our children have been taught about Rights and how to respect the rights of others. We have increased the levels of respectful behaviours in school and how our children are expected to behave.

Please can we extend our Rights Respecting ethos to our parents and carers. Please ensure that when you are anywhere in the school environment that you should show respectful behaviour and language. This includes speaking in a controlled and low voice, using appropriate language (no foul language or swearing). If you are upset or angry about something that has happened to you or your child at school, please try to keep calm when voicing your concerns. You can either talk about your concerns to your child's class teacher or to the office staff who will make an appointment for you to discuss your concerns with the appropriate member of staff. Please be assured that all concerns will be investigated and dealt with fully when all the circumstances have been ascertained.

## Police Message

This message has been received from North Yorkshire Police to be relayed to all parents/carers:-

Police forces across the country have been issuing alerts after a wave of

#### **Terrifying 'knocker' SCAM:**

burglaries-doorstep-duster

crimes involving gangs of men who claim to be selling cleaning products but actually are scoping out the victims house in preparation for a burglary at a later date. The scam often involves sellers - also known as Nottingham Knockers - who claim to be a reformed convict trying to make a new life for themselves or to be deaf or dumb and in need of cash to pay for their carer. The crooks go between houses appearing to offer a range of cleaning products but are secretly checking how much cash may be in the house, whether the home is occupied or empty at certain times, how valuable the belongings are and how well protected the house is. A few days or weeks later, a different member of the gang returns to burgle the house using the intelligence gathered by the initial doorstep trader. Some scammers reportedly even sniff the bank notes they are paid with to judge whether they may have come from a larger wad of cash being stored somewhere in the house. So-named because the original scammers hailed from Nottingham and would come knocking door-to-door to trade their wares, the scam has spread across the country, sparking a number of police alerts. Forces across the country have issued warnings to vulnerable residents, especially the elderly, to be on their guard. In some cases doorstep hawkers have forced their way inside a property after being told to go away. Those who do pay up risk being added to a list of willing customers and are then targeted by other street sellers.
