Attendance focus September 2017:

Attendance remains a focus for school as good attendance has a direct impact on your child's attainment and social and emotional well-being in school.

Not every illness needs to keep your child from school. If you keep your child away from school, be sure to inform us on the first day of their absence. 01757702464

NHS direct guidance states the following:

Use common sense when deciding whether or not your child is too ill to attend school. Ask yourself the following questions.

- Is my child well enough to do the activities of the school day? If not, keep your child at home.
- Does my child have a condition that could be passed on to other children or school staff? If so, keep your child at home.
- Would I take a day off work if I had this condition? If so, keep your child at home

Your Child can attend school with the following conditions:	Your child should not attend school with the following conditions and medical advice should be sought
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Minor cough and cold</li> <li>• Minor Headache</li> <li>• Sore Throat</li> <li>• Stomach ache</li> <li>• Head lice</li> <li>• Toothache</li> <li>• Impetigo- with treatment</li> <li>• Infections that are being treated by antibiotics (Ear, eye)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Chickenpox</li> <li>• Impetigo - before it has been treated</li> <li>• Cough and cold accompanied by a raised temperature, shivers or drowsiness</li> <li>• Vomiting and diarrhoea. Children with diarrhoea and/or vomiting should definitely be kept off school until at least 48 hours after their symptoms have gone (if your child has another medical condition that can cause this please come into school to discuss this- ie food allergies)</li> </ul>

Please inform a member of school staff that your child is not 100% well

Just a polite reminder that medications including paracetamol based painkiller and prescribed antibiotics can be given in school if medication forms are completed- these are available from the school office.

Please note that we cannot dispense Ibuprofen that has not been prescribed by a doctors.
