Attendance in the Spotlight: Tackling Lateness

Since September 2016 as a school (not including Roarys) we have had 12605 minutes of missed learning, this equates to 35 full school days. These figures arise from children who arrive at school late.

As the winter season draws on and the mornings and evenings are still cold and dark, more and more children are arriving for school after 9am and occasionally after 9.30am. We are starting to hear various excuses for lateness which relate to alarms either not being set, or not going off and generally families just sleeping in!

We recognise that it is hard for everybody, staff, parents and children alike to get up early as the season changes but prompt attendance at school is a MUST, so please ensure that those batteries are checked, alarms are set and your children arrive on time.

If your child is having trouble getting to sleep, it is worth bearing in mind that latest studies show that using technology which have lit screens before bedtime, can disrupt sleep patterns by delaying the onset of sleep. Also, a late start to the day is unsettling for your child(ren) and for the rest of the class when they enter the classroom whilst the lesson is already in progress.

The following attendance points apply to all children in full-time school:-

- 8.50am KS1 and KS2 door open CLASSES BEGIN.
- 9.00am Register attendance marks are recorded.
- 9.10am Registers are closed children arriving after this time are marked as LATE.
- 9.30am children arriving after this time are marked as having an unauthorized mark for the entire morning which affects and lowers their overall attendance percentage.

<u>WARNING</u> – As few as 19 missed days over the school year reduces a child's chances of success. SATs could drop by 1 grade across all subjects!

As a school, we will taking a close look at lateness and how to address the issues around this including how children who do arrive late can make up for their lost learning time. Please look out for a letter coming home to all children (excluding Roarys) this half-term with further details.

Readathon - Helping Children

We are excited to announce that we will shortly be participating in 'Readathon' - the UK's national sponsored reading event for schools. As well as encouraging and inspiring the children to read for pleasure, it also raises money to help children in hospitals.

Our three week event will launch on March 1st and land two and a half weeks' later, on March 17th. Children will be given a sponsor form just after half term, so they can ask people they know to sponsor them.

Since 'Readathon' is really about developing a love and thirst for reading, we will be setting more time aside in school to run more extended than usual 'read for pleasure' sessions over the period. We will also be asking the children to record their 'Readathon' sessions at home as well and would appreciate your support in encouraging your children with this. Rather than sponsoring per book, we would recommend an overall total amount for sponsoring your child to take part in the event itself, placing the onus on their enjoyment and participation, instead of simply ticking off books read.

Before they begin the event, children will be asked to think about the books they intend to read or listen to. These can be recorded in the front of the sponsorship card as they go.

In line with our house points reward system, the children will also earn points for fully participating, with the winning team gaining a special prize.


We look forward to hearing about all the exciting books that the children have been reading.
