

# Selby Community Primary School PSHE Progression

This document aims to track expectations for PSHE at Selby Community Primary School.

## What the National Curriculum says:

The National Curriculum provides pupils with an introduction to the essential knowledge that they need to be **educated citizens**.

**Personal, social, health and economic (PSHE) education** is an important and necessary part of all pupils' education. All schools should make provision for personal, social, health and economic education, drawing on good practice.

We expect schools to use their PSHE education programme to equip pupils with a **sound understanding of risk** and with the knowledge and skills necessary to **make safe and informed decisions**.

## PSHE entitlement:

PSHE provision is delivered through a combination of discrete, taught sessions and also through a cross-curricular dimension.

Where possible, links will be made to the PSHE objectives throughout all areas of the curriculum. Additional activities that promote PSHE include group, class or school events and initiatives e.g. whole school events and community projects, school productions, assemblies for parents and friends and regular celebration assemblies.

## PSHE Objectives

Our objectives for PSHE are taken from the North Yorkshire Framework for PSHE. In Early Years, PSHE is related to the objectives set out in the Early Learning Goals matching the aim of developing a child's personal, emotional and social development.

The PSHE framework is structured into six themes:

- Me and my relationships
- Keeping myself safe
- My healthy lifestyle
- Me and my future
- Becoming an active citizen
- Moving on

The key aspects of PSHE and Citizenship and SEAL covered within these themes are:

Sex and Relationships	E-safety
